Refugees Finding Hope and Transformation Through Craftsmanship in the midst of adversity, a group of resilient refugees have embarked on a journey of hope, transformation, and empowerment. They are refugees from the Democratic Republic of the Congo who have found solace and strength in their newfound skills and entrepreneurial spirit, thanks to the Individuals and Together We Can group.

Mama Charlie Motuta - A Beacon of Resilience

Meet Mama Charlie, a Congolese woman who once lived in the Equateur Province. Her life was forever altered by the conflict, forcing her and her family to seek refuge in Uganda. "I am a widow, a mother of six children, and one grandchild. My husband perished in the war, and with no one left to protect us, we fled to Bukavu. However, even there, the war followed us. In 2011, we finally reached Kampala, where I learned that I was HIV positive due to sexual abuse during the war. Life was harsh, but a lifeline emerged when I joined an HIV program, receiving counseling, business management training, and capital to start my craft business. Since then, my life has taken a positive turn."

Ange Bahati - Rising from the Ashes

Ange's story is one of resilience and hope. She was born and raised in Congo, where life was once peaceful until conflict engulfed her hometown in 2015. Ange lost her parents and siblings in a nightmarish night of torture and violence. She managed to escape, finding her way to Kampala, Uganda, as a refugee. Her life depended on the kindness of others who provided food and temporary shelter. It was at a Congolese church in Katwe that she discovered her pregnancy, a result of the war's abuse. Years later, she embarked on a transformative journey, receiving training in crafts and launching her own business, improving the lives of her family along the way.



Noella Mukulima -Stitching a New Life

Noella's life took an unexpected turn when war forced her to flee her hometown in Congo in 2018. Alone in a foreign land, she struggled to find her footing until she encountered a Congolese pastor who connected her with a rescue foundation. There, she honed her sewing skills and began her journey towards self-sufficiency. Noella's encounter with I-Strive Marketplace as a client opened doors to support herself and meet her needs.

Beatrice Mbambu -Sewing Through Adversity

Beatrice is a seamstress from Beni, Congo, a city plagued by ongoing violence. Her refugee journey began after surviving abuse that resulted in the loss of her pregnancy. "I lost my husband, my house was in ruins, so fleeing to Uganda was the only option, and I have been here since 2017." Sewing and crafting have become her lifeline, providing not only a small income but also a therapeutic escape from her traumatic experiences.

Shulungu Rachel -Crafting a Brighter Future

Shulungu Feza Rachel, hailing from Beni, Congo, faced the brutality of civil war. In 2016, she and her family sought refuge in Uganda, arriving with nothing and facing numerous challenges. Language barriers and daily needs were constant struggles. In 2019, Rachel's life took a positive turn when she discovered a training program for bag design. Selling these handbags in her small store allowed her to send her children to school.

Blandine Kokusa - A New Beginning

Blandine Kokusa, a Congolese single mother, sought refuge in Kampala in 2015 to escape the horrors of war. Life as a refugee and sole provider for her children was incredibly challenging. But, through a rescue foundation, she gained training in handbag making, enabling her to move her family into a new home and enroll her children in school.



Rosine Penge - Artistic Resilience

Rosine, born into a large family in Congo, faced adversity when her stepbrother tried to seize her father's school. Her refusal led to a violent attack, prompting her escape to Uganda. She took on various jobs until she found an apprenticeship, enabling her to sell her handicrafts at the market.

Mama Dady - Surviving and Thriving

Mama Dady, a single mother of five, fled to Uganda after experiencing violence during the war in eastern Congo. She established her business in 2017, which has been her source of livelihood ever since.





Tumbiwine Enid -Crafting a Future

Tumbwine, a Ugandan-born single mother, transitioned from being a kindergarten teacher to crafting sandals during the COVID-19 pandemic. With her daughters, she adapted to the changing circumstances and now aims to expand her business.

Kajeje Elise - From Surviving to Thriving

Kajeje Elise, a survivor of abduction and torture, escaped the horrors of war in Congo to seek refuge in Uganda. Through resilience and determination, she ventured into jewelry making and crafts, envisioning a future where her products reach a global audience.

Sylvia Namirembe- Against All Odds

I am Sylvia Namirembe, a married mother of three children, consisting of one boy and two girls. My eldest child is a girl who is coping with cerebral palsy. I have faced considerable challenges when it comes to securing employment, as finding a caregiver who can consistently tend to my daughter's needs has proven to be a daunting task. In response to this predicament, I made the decision to embark on a crochet bag business during the COVID-19 pandemic.



Aziza Penge's Story





After facing insecurities in my home country, I arrived in Uganda in July 2015 at Nakivale Camp. Being young and alone, I managed to survive for four months until I met a pastor from Kampala who came to do evangelism and heard my story. He offered me help and took me to Kampala, where I joined his church named Bethel and enrolled in secondary school. It was there that I met a mentor who was a talented painter. During the holidays, I honed my painting skills. Once I completed secondary school, I started painting as a way to make a living, using only two colors (black and white) and small canvases. I sold some of my artwork, which enabled me to open my own art studio. Through I-Strive Marketplace, I was able to sell more of my art and showcase my talents to the world.
